Kathy Turk and Food Forward Gather Produce for Food Pantry-LAX

Three and a half years ago Kathy Turk, from the Holy Nativity Church in Westchester, decided she wanted to expand the work done with the Holy Nativity community garden (providing much needed fresh produce to Food Pantry-LAX) to the farmer's markets in the area. Kathy went to the Santa Monica Farmers Market and began talking to farmers about donating their excess produce to Food Pantry-LAX. She said, "I needed to act on that; I needed to ask."

The farmers were sometimes hesitant to donate their produce to Kathy so she took a letter from Father Peter at Holy Nativity explaining that the donation was tax deductible and that it was going directly to feed those in need.

As Kathy began regularly gleaning from the Farmer's Market she developed relationships with the farmers. Through her association with the farmers she found that the best day for gleaning was Sunday when the farmers needed to discard their produce to make way for the following week's harvest. As she was more and more successful with gleaning from the Farmers Market, Kathy realized this task was

a lot for one person to take on.

Kathy began asking around for volunteers and trying to find people who could help gather produce from the



Market for Food Pantry-LAX. Eventually she was introduced to Anne Burmeister who was working on a grant for Food Forward to fund a Farmers Market recovery program. Anne and Kathy realized they were doing the same thing at the same time. Anne introduced Kathy to Mary Baldwin the Director of Food Forward's Farmers Market Recovery Program and Kathy began partnering with Food Forward to do her weekly gleaning at the Santa Monica

Farmers Market. Kathy and Food Forward glean anywhere from 100-600lbs. of produce each Sunday.

Since the introduction was first made, Food Forward has shared their valuable name and volunteer resources to support the work Kathy began all on her own. In addition to the work Kathy and Food Forward do at the Farmers Markets, they harvest produce from local homeowners who are willing to share the produce from their gardens. Since Food Forward began doing backyard harvests five years ago they have gathered 2 million pounds of produce.

Homeowners who are interested in donating their produce to Food Pantry-LAX can contact Food Forward. Food Forward will either come to the house to harvest the crop or will provide boxes for collecting the produce – whichever the homeowner prefers. If you are interested in registering your fruit trees or other garden produce with Food Forward you can go to their website www.foodforward.org where you will find more information about registering your garden or trees and also to find information about helping with local harvests. ♦

continue to feed the people we do. However, we are grateful for and dependent on you who send \$10 or \$25 per month or contribute generously to the plate that is passed around at the Good

Friday and Thanksgiving services. The majority of contributions come in small pieces, and it has come for many years. Thank you.

As one of the articles in this issues notes, we lost one of our long time stalwarts, Becky Weber, late last year. After many years of service, she retired to be more with family. We

have a number of volunteers who have been with us many years and provide a core of experience and committed people who give continuity to our activities. Without them, it would be a lot more difficult to do what


